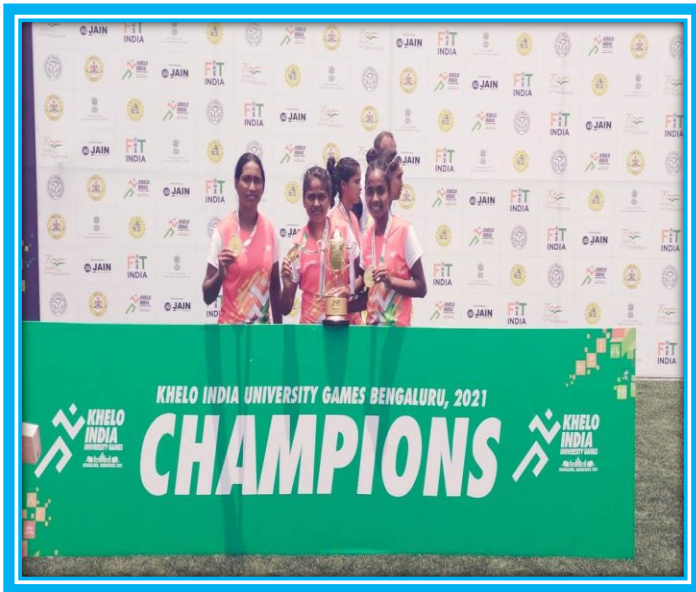

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## The Preamble

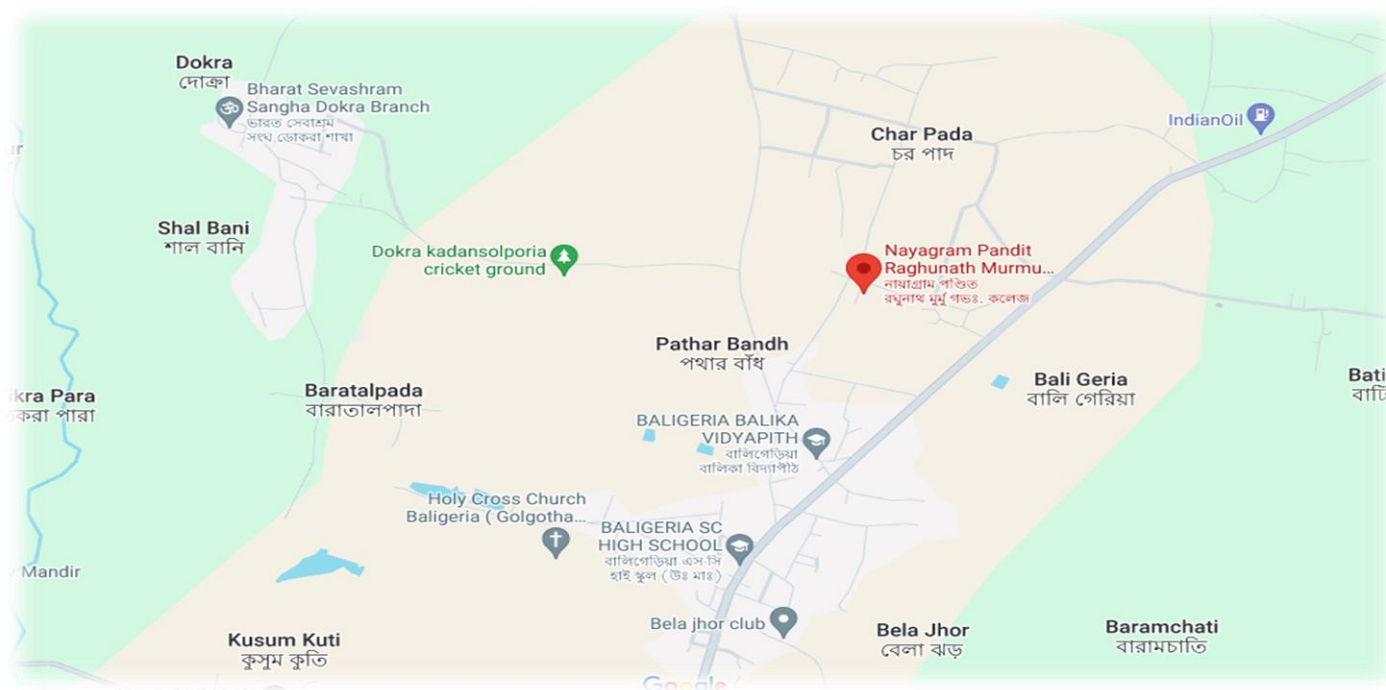
Nayagram Pandit Raghunath Murmu Government College is named after the founder of Ol Chiki script for Santali language, Pandit Raghunath Murmu. , who was was an Indian Santali writer and educator. He was born in May 1905 to parents Nandlal Murmu and Salma Murmu, in Dahardih village of Mayurbhanj state ( now in Orissa ). He was named Chunu Murmu after his birth. However, during his naming ceremony the priest named him as ‘Raghunath’. After his matriculation in 1924, he joined the Baripada Power House as an apprentice. Later, under the auspices of later P.K.Singh, he received technical training at three different places of West Bengal – Serampore in Hooghly district, Shantiniketan in Birbhum district and Gosaba in South 24 Parganas. After acquiring the necessary technical education, he worked as a teacher for a short period in Baripada Training Institute following which he joined as a teacher at Badamtalia Primary school in 1933.

Raghunath Murmu’s first book ‘Horh Sereng’, in Ol chiki script was published in 1936. He published his first play ‘Bidu-Chandan’ in 1942 where he described Bidu ( God ) and Chandan ( Goddess ) who came to earth as human beings , invented the Ol chiki script to express their affection for each other. When this play was exhibited in a function at Baripada, the King of Mayurbhanj state realised how valuable that invented script was ! Many people came to see this play when it was staged in his native village. Later on , he started visiting different Santali villages in Mayurbhanj and Jharkhand to teach the use of the new script. He gained wide popularity as a teacher and Santali people lovingly started calling him ‘pandit’. During nationalist movement he got labelled as a nationalist, and even after independence when he became an ardent

supporter of Jharkhand Movement, an arrest warrant was also issued against him. He had to flee Baripada, and took a job at Tata Steel in Jamshedpur. Alongwith his friend Sadhu Murmu, he relentlessly went on spreading og Ol chiki script. He authored different books including ‘Parsi Poha’, Parsi Itun’, ‘Ranarkh, Alkha’, ‘Ol Chemed ‘etc for learning Ol Chiki. In this way, a language which never had a script and had to be passed down orally through generations, gained its own identity. Nayagram Govt College, which bears the name of such a personality vows to play a crucial role in the advancement of the tribal belt which is the catchment area of the institution.

## Location

The college is located at Baligeria village, in Nayagram Block, Jhargram District, West Bengal. It is adjacent to its neighbouring state Orissa, and the area is popularly known as 'jangalmahal' meaning 'the jungle estates'. The nearest railway station is Kharagpur Junction which is approximately 55 kms from the institution. It is situated at a distance of 12 Kms from Jangal kanya Setu which stands on Subarnarekha River, acts as the dividing line between Paschim Medinipur and Jhargram District. The institution is situated just beside Nayagram Block Development Office, and the main road which runs alongside the college links Kharagpur Railway station with Dhumsai, lying on the border of the two states, West Bengal and Orissa. This road is known as Kumsol-Baligeria-Kharikamathani-Nayagram Road.

## **CBCS EXAMINATION PATTERN**

Eligibility of the students for appearing in ESE:

- Must have 75% class attendance (Theory and Practical separately)
- Must complete Internal Assessment.

Internal Assessment:

- Tutorials/ class tests / seminar presentations or any combination thereof evenly distributed over the study period.
- If a candidate fails to secure pass grade ( 40% marks including the marks of Internal Assessment separately in theory and practical both for Honours and General) in a particular course, he/she will have to appear at that course only. The Internal Assessment marks (including class Attendance) will be retained for next examinations.
- If a candidate secure pass marks in Practical papers / Project work but fails to secure pass marks in theoretical paper, the marks of Practical Papers/ Project works along with Internal assessment of Theoretical Papers shall be retained.

## **MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION**

*Medium of Instruction in the class rooms will be Bengali / English. Students will have to write their answer in Bengali/English.*

## **CHANGE OF SUBJECTS**

*Change of subject may be done as per rule of the Vidyasagar University (CBCS regulations).*

## **Additional rules regarding admission**

- 1. Rules regarding admission to 1st Semester as laid down by the Department of Higher Education, West Bengal State Govt. & V.U will be strictly followed for online admission.*
- 2. Students who have passed Higher Secondary or equivalent examination with minimum 45% marks in the subject or related subject are eligible to apply for admission in the Honours course.*
- 3. Students carrying pass marks in at least five subjects are eligible to apply for admission in General course.*
- 4. Admission be done on Merit basis and Merit point for admission in Honours Course is to be calculated by adding 10% total marks obtained in the 'best five' subjects at Higher Secondary/ equivalent examination and the marks obtained in the subject or a related subject in which the admission in Honours Course is sought.*

***5. Merit point for admission in General Course is to be calculated by adding the marks obtained in 'best five' subjects at Higher Secondary/ equivalent examination.***

***6. For admission in General and Honours Course a student must secure pass marks passed in two language subjects of which one must be English at Higher Secondary/ equivalent examination.***

***7. If any student of Science stream at Higher Secondary/ equivalent examination applies for Honours Course in Bengali/ English / Hindi, his/ her merit point is to be calculated proportionately by deducting marks obtained in the practical examination.***

## Eligibility Criteria

- ✚ In case of Board/Council other than W.B.C.H.S.E., a candidate shall have to pass in five [four, where applicable] recognized subjects of full marks not being less than 100 out of which one will be English. For them the merit point will be calculated converting their % of marks into 500.
- ✚ Marks obtained in top five subjects shall be considered to ascertain the aggregate marks of a candidate passing the examination under grade system. Also for candidates passing H.S. (10+2) Examination from the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education under old system, marks obtained in top five subjects will be considered to determine the aggregate marks.
- ✚ Marks obtained in Environmental Studies as a compulsory subject in the H.S. (10+2) Examination conducted by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent will not be taken into account for calculation of the aggregate marks in top five subjects for the purpose of admission.
- ✚ Candidates will not be considered for admission after a lapse of more than 3 (three) years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination or discontinuation of recognized regular courses of study after passing the previous qualifying examination.

### ✚ For Honours Degree:

45% marks in aggregate or 50% marks in the subject applied for or related subjects (TABLE-A)\* at the previous qualifying examination.

### ✚ For General Degree Courses:

Applicant must qualify the H.S. or equivalent examination.

**Note: Candidates who have already come under examination system will not be eligible to take admission in this college again.**

## Explanation

- ❖ Applicants, who have passed the H.S. (10+2) Examination in the year 2020/2021/2022 are eligible to apply for Graduate Course in this college.
- ❖ A candidate shall be allowed to take up the Honours subject(s) under heading '(X)' if she/he has passed the subject(s) under heading '(Y)' in respective rows in the previous qualifying examination.

## PROCESS OF MERIT POINT CALCULATION:

$$\text{Merit Point} = X + Y$$

X = 10 percent of marks in aggregate in the 10+2 level exam taking 5 best marks among all the subjects excluding the marks of Environmental Studies.

Y = percentage of marks in the subject applied as Honours. If that subject is not studied, the percentage of marks of one subject as indicated in the table below will be considered.

**Note:** that if more than one candidate score same merit point, preference will be given to higher Y; in this way, if more than one candidate have same score in Y, preference will be given to higher X.

**Admission to all Honours/General courses will be strictly on the basis of eligibility criteria and merit.**
